On December 15, 2008, the Board of Trustees of the Clifton Park-Halfmoon Public Library held a certification and plaque ceremony to conclude the LEED® certification process. The Clifton Park-Halfmoon Public Library successfully achieved LEED certification for its advanced environmental building design and operation. LEED, Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design, is a program sponsored by the U.S. Green Building Council that sets specific design and performance criteria for green building design and operation. Certification comes only

when the completed building demonstrates achieved performance to original design parameters.
