Schedule released for ice storm pickup

Ice storm debris pickup by the town's contractors will begin in Clifton Park on April 1st and continue until all debris is cleaned up, officials announced Thursday.

The town has been divided into eight areas in which cleanup will take place. Each week in April, the town's contractors will clean one area in the northern part of town and one area in the southern part of town (see attached map on next page.) The clean up schedule is as follows:

Area 1: (April 1 to April 7)

North: All areas north of Route 146A from MacElroy Road to Main Street, then north of Carlton Road and Van Patten Road, but south of Ushers Road to Main Street and then south of MacElroy Road to Route 146A.

South: all areas west of Moe Road between Grooms Road and Route 146 westerly to Miller Road and all subdivisions off Miller Road.

Area 2: (April 8 to April 14)

North: All areas north of Ushers Road and MacElroy Road, west from Veterans' Memorial Park to the Northway.

South: All areas east of Moe Road to the Northway between Route 146 and Grooms Road.

Area 3: (April 15 to April 21)

North: All areas south of Plank Road and Kinns Road but East of Tanner Road and North of Route 146.

South: All areas south of Crescent Road from Exit 8 to Vischer Ferry Road.

Area 4: (April 22 to April 28)

North: All areas north of Plank Road to its intersection with Kinns Road then all areas south of Kinns Road easterly to Route 9.

South: All areas between Grooms Road and Crescent Road from the Northway to Vischer Ferry Road.

For the neighborhoods of Old Nott Farm and Country Club Acres, as well as the nearby western rural area, residents are encouraged to place their debris on the curbside by April 1. Town highway crews and contractors will clear debris from these areas as time allows.

Highway Superintendent Rick Kukuk and Supervisor Phil Barrett expect that the vast majority of debris will be picked up by April 28. Contractors and highway crews will make second passes to clean any major debris left behind after the first pass was made.

Any small amounts of remaining ice storm debris left near the curbside will be cleared by highway crews by the end of spring.
