



Town's second-ever shredding day a success

More than 500 pounds of food donated to Jonesville Food Pantry

More than 100 families disposed of their sensitive documents they wished to have shredded and donated over 500 pounds of food at the town's second-ever shredding day on Sunday, May 31.

Residents brought documents such as bank statements, credit card records, tax bills and other documents with personally identifiable information.

3N Document Destruction collected the donations for delivery to the Jonesville Food Pantry and will sell the shredded paper to be recycled and sold to a local paper products company.

"This is a great program that provided a service to residents and a donation to our community at no cost to taxpayers," Supervisor Phil Barrett said.

"We were pleased that both 3N and Clifton Park Center agreed to partner with us on this event for a second time."

The Clifton Park Center mall provided the space in the parking lot near Dunkin Donuts for the event.

3N Document Destruction delivered the food donations to the Jonesville Food Pantry on Wednesday, June 3 along with Councilwoman Lynda Walowit.

The company also gave the pantry a cash donation to support their operations.

"Some residents brought in only a few documents to be shredded but gave bags of food to the pantry," Walowit said. "Once again, our residents showed their amazing generosity to the area's most needy."

The town hosted a similar shredding event on Saturday, Nov. 15 at Clifton Park Center.

Barrett said that town officials decided to hold another shredding event because of the success of November's shredding day and recent interest from residents.
