

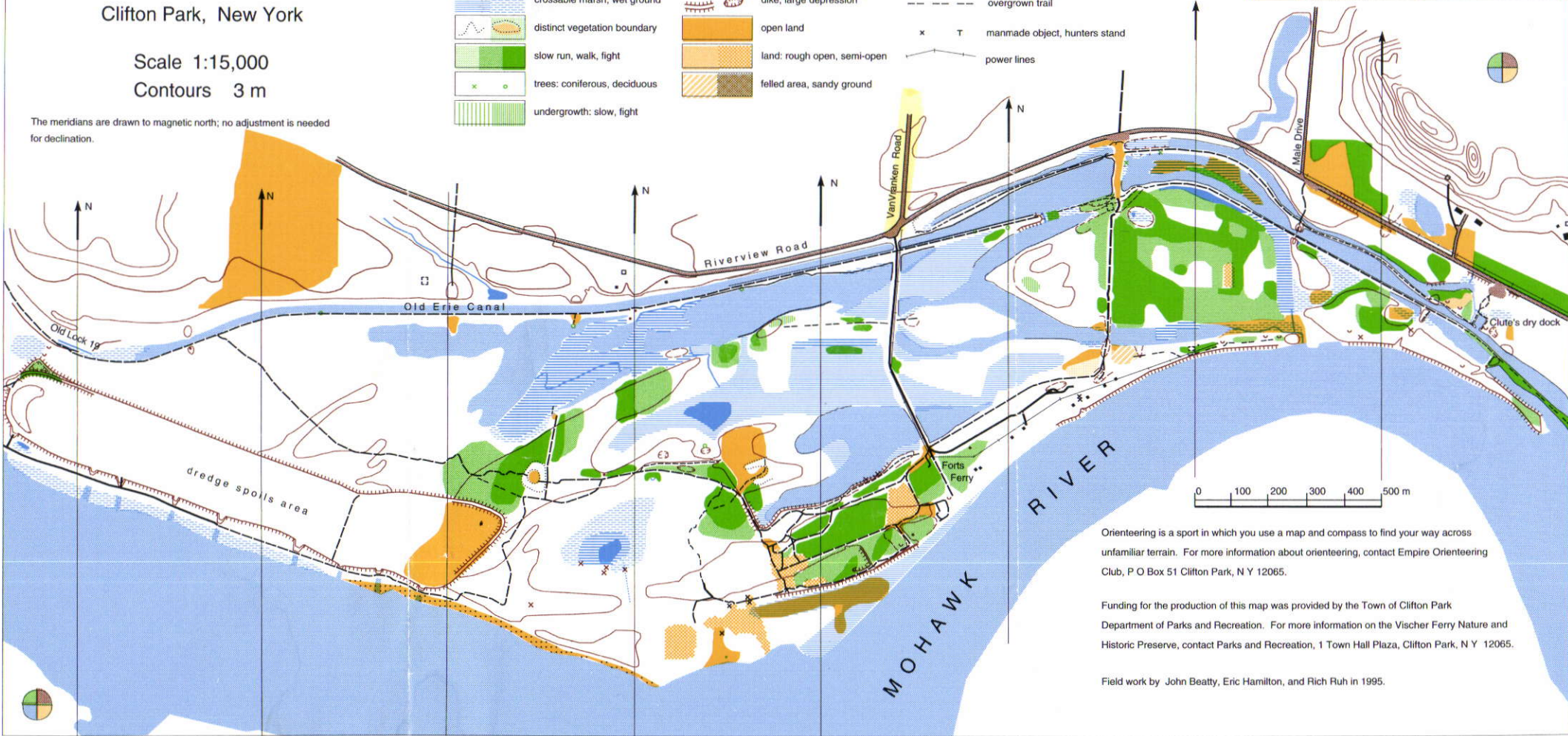
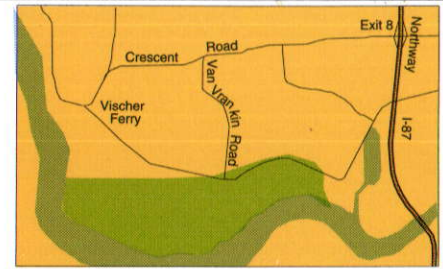
# An Orienteering Map Of VISCHER FERRY NATURE AND HISTORIC PRESERVE
